## Utah's Disaster Crisis Counselor Program

Utah Responds' Disaster Crisis Counselor Program is part of a national network of more than 300,000 registered Medical Reserve Corps volunteers who work to improve the health and safety of their communities.

We train Disaster Crisis Counselor volunteers to help their communities, loved ones, or first responders in times of emergencies and disasters. Not all survivors will develop severe mental health problems or difficulties in their recovery, but all should have access to support for a range of reactions and symptoms that can be helped by compassionate and caring disaster responders.

Utah's Disaster Crisis Counselors are a foundational piece in the larger system of crisis, emergency, and disaster preparedness and response, especially when localized and regional resources are depleted. Our crisis counselors have been active in several disasters, including support for Hurricane Katrina survivors, and most recently, providing critical behavioral health support in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.



## How do I become trained as a Disaster Crisis Counselor?

Utah DHHS provides a free annual certification training where you will learn disaster crisis counseling skills. This training is designed for first responders, school personnel, healthcare providers, faith-based organizations, disaster relief organizations, Community Emergency Response Teams, Medical Reserve Corps, Citizens Corps, or behavioral health providers.

In addition, there are 2 free online courses that are required to become certified:

Psychological First Aid and Skills for Psychological Recovery.
