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## **INSTRUCTIONS**

UCA 26B-5-403(6): "... a child may be temporarily committed to the physical custody of a local mental health authority only in accordance with the emergency procedures described in Subsection 26B-5-331 (1) or (2). A child temporarily committed in accordance with those emergency procedures may be held for a maximum of 72 hours, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays. At the expiration of that time period, the child shall be released unless the procedures and findings required by this section have been satisfied." 26B-5-331 also states that "[t]ransportation of persons with a mental illness pursuant to Subsections (1) and (2) shall be conducted by the appropriate municipal, or city or town, law enforcement authority or, under the appropriate law enforcement's authority, by ambulance or nonemergency secured behavioral health transport to the extent that Subsection.
